



Onikooko Primary School: Situation

- Location:
 - The primary school is located in Onikooko village which is a rural AFIJIO community.
- Student Population:
 - There are approximately 400 students at the school from 1st to 6th grade.
- Condition:
 - Deplorable and dilapidated classroom blocks, most with collapsed walls and roofs.
 - At least 50% of the students receive instructions outside in the open, and under trees.
 - No safe drinking water, and no sanitary toilet facilities.

Onikooko Primary School Project Objectives

- To lift up the children of the Onikooko village by providing a reasonable and sanitary learning environment which includes:
 - -a new water well; and
 - a new building block with two classroom units.

Project Commencement – May 29, 2008

Although not a massive structure, this classroom block was erected in the village at incredible speed.



• Next Steps:

Official Commissioning slated for August 29, 2008.

 This building block contains two classrooms that will accommodate 80 students.

 AOOF will raise funds to furnish classrooms with durable chairs and tables.


