Summer 2007 Outreach

Greetings! I hope you're enjoying your Summer in good health. It's been an exceptionally dry year in Nigeria, but I thought I should share an update on our common vision with you. Thankfully, the AOOF borehole project in Ilora went online in the Spring. It is providing much-needed relief not only in terms of share availability, but more importantly, the quality of water supply.

The on-going maintenance/operational support model is still under review, but we found out early in the commissioning process that location is critical. The submersible pump of the borehole is operated by electrical power.

Once the borehole pipings are installed, the hole is sealed tight.

Unfortunately, power supply in Nigeria is irregular at best, especially in remote areas like the AFIJIO community. It was important that the borehole either had its own independent power supply (power generator, solar battery, power inverter, etc.), or installed adjacent to a building with access to power supply.

He has volunteered for and is currently serving in the daily operations support role.

So, although the formal grand opening of the borehole is scheduled to coincide with the 2007 Outreach events in October, the taps of the borehole are flowing with safe, clean drinking water. Thousands of lives will be impacted positively by clean drinking water from this borehole, and it is all owed to the AOOF supporters.
