#### **Summer 2008 Outreach Update**

Greetings! I hope this note finds you and yours in good health and peace. I know, personally and for some of you, the year has been especially fast and extremely eventful. I wish you God's grace in all you do.

First, let me say "thank you" for your support of A.O.O.F.'s efforts over the years. This year's events will mark our 5<sup>th</sup> year anniversary. Amazingly, you have stayed with us along this journey, and have encouraged us every step of the way. We appreciate you.

### 2007 Recap:

In 2007, we set out to (a) increase our scholarship offerings from 36 to 45; (b) increase the number of lives we touched with the health fair events from 1200 to 1600; and (c) help an adopted primary school erect a new functional classroom block, equipped with a simple library. At the close of 2007, we were close to meeting all those goals.

Although we fell short of our fundraising goals for 2007 by nearly \$6,200 (\$24,926 vs. \$18,753), we had a very successful year. We went live with our 1<sup>st</sup>-generation website, commissioned our first borehole, increased our scholarship offerings to 47, and served nearly 1300 children and adults in 4 days of health fair outreach events!

### Onikooko Primary School Building Project:

Because of our shortfall in budget in 2007, we postponed the start of the construction of the classroom block at the Onikooko Primary School until we had enough funding to complete the project. By the middle of Spring 2008, and due to the strong commitment of some of our supporters to see this project to completion, we successfully raised the necessary incremental funds. On May 29, 2008, we broke ground on the construction of the new classroom block. In an amazing feat of disciplined construction project management in a small remote village in Nigeria, the building is now erected, waiting to be fitted with doors and windows!

# First Partnership Project To Deliver Water Well:

In March 2008, the first AOOF partnership project to deliver water well to a rural community was commissioned. To underscore our commitment to leveraging all resources to deliver value to the AFIJIO community, AOOF partnered with Wells4Africa and the IITA (International Institute for Tropical Agriculture) School to deliver the first water well funded exclusively by Wells4Africa in the AFIJIO community. This water well was a crucial element to the onsite formation of the cement blocks used for the Onikooko School building.

To alleviate this constraint, we are returning to holding the AOOF Annual Outreach Events in the Summer. The dates for this vear's events are August 24 - 30, 2008.

Some of you have been a part of this vision right from the beginning, offering unwavering support and encouragement in many different ways. Some of you joined us along the way, and your new energy and commitment to this work continue to sustain us along this journey.
